POSITION

The Regional Coordinator, Let's Talk Science Outreach is responsible for overseeing the day-to-day operations of the Let's Talk Science Outreach program in Western Canada. This includes strengthening communications with post-secondary site coordinators; gathering information about site activities, opportunities, and challenges; coaching and mentoring wherever possible to assist site coordinators with their endeavours; sharing information between sites; creating a sense of community and working with the rest of the Youth & Volunteer Experience team to ensure overall program success. This position is also responsible for monitoring and developing relationships with host post-secondary partners and working with community stakeholders to enhance the profile of Let's Talk Science in Canada's west. In addition, as a member of the national Youth & Volunteer Experience team, this position will contribute to the success of other team projects.

Responsibilities:

- Work with the Youth & Volunteer Experience team to develop and implement a program strategy including work plans, proposals for future program activities, and annual program budget for Canada's west
- Support coordinators at post-secondary partner sites in the west by maintaining regular communication including e-mail, telephone, and personal visits
- Support Site Coordinators in the west with Post-Secondary Senior Administration relationship building and institutional fundraising
- Oversee program administration (contracts, agreements, stipend payments, promotional item orders, budgets etc.) for Western outreach sites
- Work closely with other team members to offer web-based opportunities for volunteer engagement
- Support annual report process at post-secondary outreach sites in Western Canada; collect and summarize site reports as required throughout the year for supporter relations or other requests for information
- Ensure all Western Canada partner sites receive an annual visit from the Youth & Volunteer Experience team, providing training as required
- Oversee start-up/launch of new post-secondary partner sites in Western Canada

- Support volunteer recognition program for western post-secondary partner sites
- Support and attend the Western regional training conference and the national training conference
- Oversee implementation of volunteer training program, with Western partner outreach sites, delivering the program as required and to external organizations in Western Canada
- Oversee and support logistics of select volunteer outreach projects in Western Canada
- Work to increase awareness of Let's Talk Science in Western Canada by developing and implementing community-based activities, which may include creating community partnerships
- Work with Community Development and Emerging Opportunities and Fund Development to manage funding and community partnerships as it relates to employee volunteer engagement in Western Canada
- Work with the Calgary and National Office staff to ensure Let's Talk Science programs and services are integrated
- Other duties as requested/required that are within the scope of the position

Requirements/Qualifications

- Post-secondary education, graduate degree in science, technology, engineering or math preferred
- Good knowledge of Microsoft Office Professional, including Microsoft Outlook
- At least two years of experience in volunteer management
- Understanding of the importance of science and technology to society
- Fully bilingual– both written and orally an asset
- Previous involvement in Let's Talk Science outreach an asset
- Experience working with Indigenous youth or communities an asset
- Willingness to travel in Western Canada (site visits, conferences,) and some travel to Ontario (staff meetings, and conferences)

Skills and Abilities

- Excellent organization and self-management skills; accuracy and attention to detail
- Proven ability to work as effective member of a team
- Professional and courteous telephone and personal manner
- Excellent oral and written communications
- Discretion and the ability to maintain confidentiality
